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## Reading/Language Arts Notes

First grade worked on learning the spelling pattern for words with a long vowel caused by two vowels being next to each other. They also started learning about the writing process: planning using story maps, then using those maps to create a draft. In LA, they learned about sentences and sentence fragments.

Second graders worked on learning that the letters -tion, -ture, and gh make a special sound when together in a word. They learned that breaking a longer word into syllables will help them to read and spell it. Finally, they learned more about homonyms and knowing which word means what. In L.A. they learned about exclamatory sentences.
