Reading: We see the clever Toad break out of jail and make his way home... or so he hoped. He had to hop off the train to avoid his pursuers. What will these animals get into next?

Science: After finishing our lesson about the various mixtures and solutions in our world, we conducted some experiments. From expanding and contracting water bottles to dissolving sugar cubes and layers of liquids, we observed the properties of certain matter. We also separated out a mystery mixture and observed chemical reactions using kitchen powders and a variety of liquids. The students enjoyed these hands-on activities, even at expense of having goggles on face.
