## News and Updates

**Religion:** David was grieved again as his son Absalom tried to take the kingdom from him, then died in battle against his father. **Math:** The 5th graders made decimal numbers seem simple, *plane-ly coordinated* their efforts to make a (graph) *point*, and *rounded* out the week with rounding mixed numbers. The 6th grade class look at transversals, triangles, and quadrilaterals from every *angle*; found the equivalent of fractions, decimals, and percents; and tried to stay *positive* while exploring the addition of integers.

**Science:** This week we practiced identifying physical changes vs. chemical changes, as well as exploring what acids and bases are, how to tell if a substance is an acid or a base, and where these types of things are useful in our world. We have one more lesson followed by our last chapter test at the end of this week.

**Social Studies:** After seeing how cities, economy, and government are similar and different throughout Europe, we wrapped up the chapter with a crash course on editorial cartoons. We will review the chapter on Western Europe on Monday with tests on Tuesday and Wednesday.
